Enclosed is a revised application for a license (XSNM03034), recently received by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, to replace the already pending application for the export of low-enriched uranium (LEU) to China for use as fuel in the Daya Bay Nuclear Power Station Units 1 and 2.

The revised application from Westinghouse is for a license to export LEU in the form of uranium dioxide pellets contained in completed fuel-assemblies to China for use as the initial core and one reload region for each of the four new power reactors which Westinghouse is also seeking an export license (XR169).

Before taking action on this request, we would appreciate your views, in accordance with established procedures and from the overall perspective of the Executive Branch, as to whether the requested export meets the applicable criteria in the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.
