SUBJECT: U.S. DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY'S DESCRIPTION OF PLANS FOR RETRIEVAL OF RADIOACTIVE WASTE AT A GEOLOGICAL REPOSITORY AT YUCCA MOUNTAIN, NEVADA

Dear Mr. Ziegler:

This letter is in response to the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE's) letter of August 17, 2004, informing the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) of DOE's approach to address retrieval in a potential license application (LA) for a nuclear waste repository at the Yucca Mountain site. As you noted in your letter, a description of plans for retrieval and alternate storage must be included in the LA as required by 10 CFR 63.21(c)(7). Your letter also clearly acknowledges the need for the repository design to preserve the option of waste retrieval as required by 10 CFR 63.111(e). DOE should provide sufficient details related to retrieval in the LA in order for NRC staff to be able to determine whether the proposed repository design in a potential LA will preserve the option of retrieval of any or all the emplaced waste, as stated in the preclosure performance objective (10 CFR 63.111(e)).

Guidance concerning the review methods and acceptance criteria that may be employed by the reviewers of a potential DOE LA is detailed in the Yucca Mountain Review Plan (Section 2.1.2). Essentially, DOE needs to design (and build) the proposed repository in such a way that the retrieval option is not rendered impractical or impossible. In order to achieve this, DOE needs to consider the potential to retrieve any or all of the waste and factor such a possibility into the design of the repository. For example, removing the backfill from an emplacement tunnel may be much more involved and complicated than backfilling the tunnel, and may not simply be a 'reversal' of the backfilling operation. The DOE Safety Analysis Report should also include a sufficiently detailed description of its plans for the alternate storage of the radioactive waste including, availability of space and a concept of operations for potential surface storage following retrieval.
