Attached are the revised comments. I believe that all the items that came up in our meeting September 24, 2002, are included. The comments are positive in the sense that they note that we don't object to the 10 μ Sv criterion for artificial nuclides and don't object to a separate paradigm for NORM. They are also positive as far as what the document and its technical basis can support. SDLs become reference points [metrics in Greeves' words] for regulatory authorities to evaluate concentrations in commodities arising from other than clearance of metals and rubble. Perhaps this meets their objective part way.
