Dear Chip:

I am enclosing a copy of a memorandum sent to me by Brad Mettam from Inyo County.

I was not aware when you and I met with Chairman Selin that the LSS responsibility had been transferred to YMSCO, and was certainly unaware that a reevaluation of the LSS was being undertaken in Las Vegas.

I was not at the June 10th AULG meeting, obviously, so I am not privy to the full extent of the conversation. Brad Mettam has told me in a phone conversation, however, it was his impression that perhaps the LSS would be developed by YMSCO, and its implementation then transferred back to DOE headquarters. He thinks that the transfer to Las Vegas was something in the nature of a funding ploy. In other words, by transferring it to YMSCO they might be able to fund LSS development as a "site characterization activity," rather than a licensing function, many of which Dreyfus has indicated will be deferred under Scenario A.

In one of my next trips to Las Vegas I hope to be able to meet with Gandi, whom I don't recall ever having met, to find out more about what is going on. In any case, I think this development needs to be very high on the agenda of the next LSSARP meeting. On that point, if, indeed, representatives from the State and many of the AULG are going to be in Rockville to meet with the Commission on September 9th, perhaps we could schedule the next LSSARP meeting around that date. I know September 6 - 9 are dates that we are already holding on our calendars for an ARP meeting.



Apparently the design and development of the LSS has been transferred to YMSCO, without any of the institutional memory. Gandi was unaware of (and unconcerned about) the discussions at the recent LSSARP.

Gandi intends to re-evaluate the LSS, and appears to have internal task groups planned. While he intends to use the Rule, there was little two-way communication going on at the meeting.

I would be interested in attending a meeting to examine these changes in more detail, but I will rely on those with more LSS experience to follow this up. Please let me know if Nye County takes any action on this.
