ORDER

(Denying Intervenors' Motion to Suspend Proceeding Pending Reinstatement of Agencywide Document Access and Management System ("ADAMS"))

This Order is in response to the joint motion of Intervenors Environmental Law and

Policy Center, Blue Ridge Environmental Defense League, Nuclear Information and Resource

Service, Nuclear Energy Information Service, and Public Citizen requesting that the subject

Early Site Permit ("ESP") licensing proceeding be suspended until 30 days after the NRC's

Agencywide Document Access and Management System ("ADAMS") is restored in its entirety.¹

On October 25, 2004, the NRC temporarily suspended public access to ADAMS pending review of the information contained therein for security purposes.² Intervenors claim that the unavailability of documents on ADAMS results in deprivation of a meaningful opportunity for a hearing. In its answer to Intervenors' motion, Applicant Exelon Generation

Company opposes Intervenors' request.³ The NRC Staff, in its answer, also opposes the request.⁴

The NRC has stated that it is "moving expeditiously to complete the necessary determinations and restore public access to appropriate documents."⁵ As the schedule currently stands, the projected release date for the Staff's Draft Environmental Impact Statement ("DEIS") is March 2005, and the projected release date for the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") is October 2005, and the parties have agreed that their final positions cannot be determined until after receipt and review of the FEIS. Therefore, hearings cannot be expected to commence before the end of CY 2005. We agree with the Applicant that due to the projected dates for the DEIS and FEIS, there is currently no activity which can be expected to be materially affected, in the reasonably near term, by the unavailability of ADAMS. Intervenors' motion to suspend the proceeding until 30 days after restoration of public access to ADAMS is therefore denied.

The Board notes, however, that if, at any point in the future, Intervenors are able to demonstrate actual delay resulting from the unavailability of ADAMS, this issue may be revisited. To do so, Intervenors must identify specific documents needed which are unavailable due to ADAMS restrictions, and identify actual time delays caused by that unavailability.
