## JOINT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME FOR MANDATORY DISCLOSURES

By order dated, November 9, 2004, the Board granted the August 30, 2004 hearing request of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) regarding the April 22, 2004 request of Safety Light Corp. (SLC or applicant) to renew its materials licenses. LBP-04-25, 60 NRC \_\_\_\_. That order, among other things, directed the parties to proceed in accordance with the time limits for mandatory disclosures and the hearing file set forth in 10 C.F.R. §§ 2.336, 2.1203. *Id.* at 19-20.

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.323, the PADEP and U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Staff (Staff) request that the time period for providing mandatory disclosures be extended from December 9 to December 30, 2004. As grounds for this motion, they state the following:

- 1. The Staff needs the requested time period to complete the identification and screening of documents subject to mandatory disclosure due to other agency screening efforts, changes in technical personnel and reassignment of counsel.
- 2. The PADEP needs the requested time period to provide the information requested by § 2.336(a) and complete its identification and review of documents subject to disclosure.

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3. The brief extension requested will not cause hardship to the active participants in the

proceeding or a substantial delay in this proceeding.

4. Because no counsel or other representative has been filed an appearance on behalf of

SLC, Staff counsel contacted William Lynch, Vice President, of Safety Light regarding this motion,

to obtain Safety Light's position regarding this request. Staff counsel hereby certifies pursuant to

10 C.F.R. § 2.323(b), that she made a sincere effort to resolve this matter with Mr. Lynch, but

Mr. Lynch indicated he could not take a position until he consulted counsel.

Based on the foregoing, the Staff and PADEP jointly request that the time to make

mandatory disclosures under 10 C.F.R. § 2.336 be extended from December 9 to December 30,

2004.
