Dear Dr. Machefsky:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 48 to your NRC Material License No. 24-15159-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note that we were unable to approve Ian Roderick Graham, M.D. as an Authorized User for the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.300 because the information in your letter dated September 2, 2004, was insufficient to complete our review.

If you wish to pursue this request please provide the information requested below, address it to my attention and reference it as "additional information to control number 313710." We will then continue our review.

Ian Roderick Graham, M.D. was not approved as an Authorized User for the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.300 because his training and experience did not appear to meet the requirements in 10 CFR 35.390 or 35.930 and 35.59.

Specifically, the preceptor forms supporting Dr. Graham's request did not indicate the clock hours and dates of his training for the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.300. We also could not verify that Dr. Dunseath was a qualified preceptor for Dr. Graham during Dr. Graham's training, due to the lack of specific information about Dr. Graham's training and our lack of access to the license Dr. Dunseath worked under during this training.

Please submit revised, currently signed and dated preceptor forms for Dr. Graham indicating the clock hours and dates of Dr. Graham's training for the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.300. Please also provide a copy of the license Dr. Dunseath worked under during this training, for the time period of the training, so that we may verify him as a preceptor in this instance. If the license in question is a broad scope license please submit a letter signed by the Radiation Safety Officer or Radiation Safety Committee Chairperson attesting that Dr. Dunseath was an authorized user for materials in 10 CFR 35.300 during the timeframes specified for Dr. Graham's training.

Please do not submit resumes, CV's, or personal, proprietary information that we must protect, in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, such as social security numbers, dates of birth, home addresses

or phone numbers, patient records, college transcripts, etc.

Please refer to NUREG 1556, Vol. 9, Item 8.11 and Appendices B, D and E for assistance in preparing your response. 10 CFR 35 and NUREG 1556, Vol. 9 are available on our website at <http://www.nrc.gov>. Then click on the "Nuclear Materials" toolbar key and the "Medical Use Licensing/Part 35" option on the Quick List.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

Please note that on October 25, 2004, the NRC suspended public access to ADAMS, and initiated an additional security review of publicly available documents to ensure that potentially sensitive information is removed from the ADAMS database accessible through the NRC's web site. Interested members of the public may obtain copies of the referenced documents for review and/or copying by contacting the Public Document Room pending resumption of public access to ADAMS.
