Dear Mr. Troup:

This letter and the enclosed NRC Form 591M refers to the inspection conducted on November 16, 2004, at the Cardinal Health facility located at 1864 Pine Ridge Drive, Jenison, Michigan. At the conclusion of the onsite inspection, preliminary findings were discussed with Ms. Kathy Benson of your organization. The inspection results were also discussed with Mr. Jack Coffey, Senior Vice President of Quality and Regulatory during a final telephonic exit briefing conducted on December 29, 2004.

The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, independent measurements, and observation of activities in progress.

Within the scope of this inspection no violations or deviations were identified; therefore, no response to this letter or the enclosed NRC Form 591M is required. Also note that a previous Severity Level IV violation issued for activities at your Jenison, Michigan, facility (NRC Inspection Report 030-33224/03-019) was reviewed during this inspection. During a review of the implementation of your corrective actions, the inspector found that Cardinal Health's "Pharmacy Practice Policy and Procedures Manual" located on its Intranet was difficult for the pharmacy staff to locate during the inspection. However, the violation was found to be corrected and is considered closed.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's document system (ADAMS). ADAMS is accessible from the NRC Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html.

Please note that on October 25, 2004, the NRC suspended public access to ADAMS, and initiated an additional security review of publicly available documents to ensure that potentially sensitive information is removed from the ADAMS database accessible through the NRC's web site.
