<p>Summary:</p> <p>I called the Pawn Shop and talked to Mr. Dunbar (owner). He stated that the gauge was brought to his shop on 10/18. He paid \$30.00 for the gauge. One of his employees checked the gauge to verify if it worked and put it back in the box. Today he heard in the news that a gauge was stolen, so he called the police and the NRC. He stated that he has the identification of the individual who sold the gauge and did every thing according to regulations.</p> <p>I told him to keep the gauge secured and away from personnel until the owner/police can come to claim it. I told him to keep the gauge secured and away from areas normally occupied by his employees or customers. He stated that he has stored the box in a corner and it is secure. He was concerned about danger to him or his personnel. I told him that he should not allow any one to stay close to the box.</p> <p>I called the licensee and had difficult time getting any technical person at their office. I left a message on Mr. El-Awar's cell phone to call me back. I later talked to him and gave him the address of the pawn shop (4859 Virginia Beach Boulevard, VA Beach). He told me that he is going there right now and would bring the gauge back to their facility. He promised to call me back when he get the gauge and inform me if there was any damage to the gauge, and if it was still operational.</p>
