Subject: Priority 5T Inspection.		
<p><u>Summary:</u> I spoke with Michael Buttil, Treasurer and Radiation Safety Officer. He stated that he believed that all of the licensed material had been transferred to the manufacturer in mid-2004. He transferred me to William Kozulak for additional information.</p> <p>Mr. Kozulak stated that soon after the NRC's contact in 2001 both units malfunctioned and were placed in storage. One unit was traded in and NITON replaced it with a generally-licensed hand-held XRF unit. The unit was leak tested in July 2004 prior to its transfer and found not to be leaking. The second unit remains in storage and will be transferred to Juhn Harrison, Inc. Mr. Kozulak indicated that the unit would be tested before the transfer was made. I provided information to Mr. Kozulak on the paperwork necessary for the licensee to terminate its license. I also informed Mr. Kozulak that the license would need to be terminated by March 31, 2005, or else the licensee would be billed for possessing a license for a full year. Mr. Kozulak indicated that he understood and would submit the termination request as soon as he possibly could.</p>
