
History

- Independent agency established by the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 to regulate civilian use of nuclear materials.




Mission

- To regulate the Nation's civilian use of byproduct, source, and special nuclear materials to ensure adequate protection of public health and safety, to promote the common defense and security, and to protect the environment.
- Main Areas: Reactors, Materials, Waste




Organization

- Five Member Commission
 - Formulates policies and regulations, issues orders, adjudicates legal matters
- Executive Director of Operations
 - Carries out the policies and decisions of the Commission and directs the activities of the program offices.
