Regarding the ROP web site, the NRR information review team worked with IIPB and agreed that the material on the web did not warrant withholding due to post 9/11 security concerns. We actually had some interactions with and buy-in by senior managers and the Commission. We do not look at each posting of inspection reports, PIs, or other info based on experience that these sources have not contained what might now be considered sensitive homeland security information.

An individual associated with the Project Matrix effort raised a question regarding publically available information from inspections. Dan Galik (OCIO) passed the question to me; however I think its more appropriate for you or NRR folks to respond.

To put the inquiry in context, Mike Lombard is a Dept of Commerce individual that OCIO and DIRO have been dealing with on Project Matrix. Project Matrix, managed by the Critical Infrastructure Assurance Office in the Dept. of Commerce, is designed to assist federal civilian agencies in prioritizing their critical infrastructure assurance efforts by: (1) identifying a list of critical assets; (2) determining significance (security, etc.); and (3) identifying associated internal and external interdependencies. NRC, as well as other Feds, are undergoing a Project Matrix review - OCIO and DIRO share this effort.
