<b>Subject:</b> Transfer of Dumpster Waste collected from Ledoux on Friday April 8 or Monday April 11, 2005		
<p>Mr. Ciampi was responsible for pickup of waste collected at Ledoux on Friday April 8 and Monday April 11, 2005. He reported that he is a waste collection truck driver for Frank Capasso Inc. and picked up the waste from Ledoux between 4 and 6 AM on the mornings of April 9 (for trash deposited at Ledoux on 4/8) and April 12 (for trash deposited at Ledoux on 4/11) respectively. On each day, he unlocked the access gate at Ledoux, hitched the dumpster to the truck, dumped at dumpster, compacted the load, exited the area and re-locked the gate. He noted nothing different during the two days in question. Later in the day, the truck was driven to the Miele transfer station by Mike Capasso where it was emptied. Mr. Ciampi reported that he did not check what was in the dumpster (nor does he typically look in part because it is still dark outside) so he did not see the twenty gallon drums in question. He stated that on the infrequent occasions when he did actually peer into the dumpster, it was not unusual to see empty sample containers and chemical bottles. Mr. Ciampi stated that no material was removed from the truck prior to turnover for travel to the transfer station. (such as for scrape reclaim, etc.).</p>
