

Participants shall have full authority to negotiate and settle the case at the conference.

Mediation statements of no more than 10 pages shall be submitted to the Circuit Mediator [fax no. (415) 556-9725] on or before July 5, 2005. Mediation statements shall contain brief statements of the following: (a) factual and procedural background; (b) issues to be raised on appeal; (c) legal argument on appeal; (d) your client's interests; (e) perceived interests of the opposing party; and (f) obstacles to settlement and proposals for overcoming them. Sections (a), (b) and (c) shall be served on counsel for the opposing party on the same date they are submitted to the undersigned. Sections (d), (e) and (f) shall be confidential and shall not be served on the opposing party. Mediation statements shall not be filed with the court.

Participants should plan to spend the entire day engaged in meaningful settlement discussions and come prepared with thoughtful solutions to this dispute.
