<p><u>Summary:</u> 5/19/2005 16:00 I left a message on Mr. Hutchinson's voice-mail for him to get back in touch with me.</p> <p>5/20/05 08:00 Mr. Hutchinson returned my call. I requested that he get back in touch with me after reviewing the regulations in 10 CFR 40.22 and determining whether the licensee wanted the Depleted Uranium under the specific license or the general license. The only restriction on the general license is that the licensee can receive no more than 15 pounds of Depleted Uranium at any one time and possess no more than 150 pounds in any one calendar year. Mr. Hutchinson stated that he would look over the regulation, consult with management, and get back to me with their decision.</p> <p>5/23/2005 09:45 I spoke with Mr. Hutchinson. He stated that the licensee wishes to have the depleted uranium on the license as a line item. I requested the name of the individual(s) who would be put on the license as supervising the work performed along with their qualifications and training in the use of radioactive material. I also requested that I be provided with any equipment or procedures taken to ensure that individuals are not exposed to depleted uranium if the metal should be "worked" in any way. Mr. Hutchinson stated that he would provide me with the requested information.</p>
