- Initial audit of LES and Nuclear Technology Solutions (NTS) Quality Assurance Programs conducted April 4-6, 2005; follow-up audit expected in September 2005

Open Items

- Confirmation of figure and units used in gas pipeline hazard calculation
- Feasibility of providing background information on DOE depleted uranium disposition costs so that these costs can be assessed in the Safety Evaluation Report (SER) – may impact issuance of SER
