

## APPLICANT'S OPPOSITION TO STATE OF UTAH'S MOTION FOR ENLARGE-MENT OF THE PAGE LIMITATION FOR REVIEW OF CONTENTION UTAH K

Applicant Private Fuel Storage L.L.C. hereby opposes the State of Utah's Motion for Enlargement of the Page Limitation for Review of Contention Utah K (dated May 24, 2005). The Commission has established a 20-page limit for petitions for review of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's decisions on aircraft accident consequences—the sole remaining issue in Contention Utah K. Order (Mar. 11, 2005). The Commission closely followed the progress of the resolution of this last issue before the Board and thus was aware of its scope when it expanded the page limit for a petition for review of this issue. There is no need to revisit that question now. The 30-page petition the State seeks to file would be unreasonably long, as it would practically amount to a brief unto itself. Indeed, the State notes that the Commission expects parties filing petitions for review to be concise in their pleadings. At this point in the case, the State ought to be able to identify the issues on which it seeks review and support its claims within the 20 pages the Commission has already provided. No more is necessary.
