Subject: CONFIRMATORY ORDER RESCINDING ORDER ISSUED JUNE 3, 2001, AND IMPOSING NEW CONDITIONS

This is to inform the Commission that a Confirmatory Order, Effective Immediately, will be issued on or about June 29, 2005, to J. L. Shepherd & Associates (JLS&A), rescinding an immediately effective Order issued by the NRC on July 3, 2001 (July 2001 Order) which withdrew approval of JLS&A's Quality Assurance (QA) Program for failure to comply with NRC requirements. This action is being taken in response to JLS&A's April 7, 2005, request to rescind the July 2001 Order, and is based on the staff's review of the following salient facts: (1) JLS&A has completed all of the elements of its Near-Term Corrective Action Plan; (2) JLS&A has demonstrated, on multiple occasions after relaxation of the July 2001 Order, that it can safely transport Type B radioactive shipments in both DOT Specification 20WC overpacks and NRC-approved CoC packages under their new NRC-approved QA program; and, (3) although minor program implementation deficiencies were found during Spent Fuel Project Office inspections in 2003 and again in 2004, these findings were of lower safety significance and none were of a severity level comparable to the original findings which fostered the issuance of the July 2001 Order.

JLS&A has requested and been granted interim relief from the July 2001 Order several times, including JLS&A's most recent request for interim relief. Based on that request and a showing of good cause, the NRC issued a Confirmatory Order, dated May 30, 2003, that allowed JLS&A to make shipments through June 1, 2005, and expanded JLS&A's shipment authorization for transportation packaging. The Staff issued an additional Order on June 1, 2005, to extend this relaxation until July 1, 2005, while the Staff completed its review of JLS&A's April 7th request. In addition to removing previous restrictions on JLS&A's participation in activities involving the packaging and transportation of radioactive material, the current Order contains five additional conditions that JLS&A has agreed to implement for a period of one year or until four successive quarterly reports performed by an Independent Auditor, whichever is longer, show continued effective implementation of the JLS&A QA Program.
