Dear Mr. Collins:

I am sending this written notification after giving Craig Gordon (610-337-5216) a phone notification of the same on 5/6/05. Based on guidance from NUREG-1556 Volume 16 Appendix K, please be advised of the following:

(A) Description of the radioactive material

Twenty-three (23) Series 700C OMNIGLOW® Self-Luminous Exit Signs

B) Description of the circumstances under which the loss or theft occurred

The College began a construction project on or about November 14, 2003 of its Student Community Center. As per a contractual agreement, Bovis Lend Lease (CONTACT: Fred Hohnhorst (609) 951-0500) was responsible for ensuring that all hazardous material generated during the renovation would be disposed of properly.

In April of 2005, the College asked for copies of the necessary documentation indicating all hazardous material had been disposed of properly. At this time, it was discovered that there were no records for the disposal of the signs, and their current location was unknown.

(C) Disposition of the radioactive material

It is unclear at this time as to the location of the missing signs. They were either stolen or thrown away with the general construction waste.

(D) Radiation exposure to individuals

To the best of my knowledge, there was no exposure while signs were being removed. Similarly, I have no reason to believe there was any exposure while signs were segregated for disposal.

(E) Actions taken to recover the material

Contractor had indicated on 5/2/05 that an internal investigation had occurred and the missing signs could not be located.

(F) Actions taken to prevent recurrence.

Incident occurred as a result of construction and remodeling. As this scope of this activity is not normal, I do not believe there will be recurrence at this time.

Should you have any questions, I would ask that you contact me at (973) 328-5551. There is a significant amount of internal documentation that has been generated regarding this incident.



RE: Missing radioactive exit signs from SCC

Harvey explained that he is responsible for completing a disposal document for hazardous materials for the 23 missing exit signs.

Jim of EJ Stewart said they began operations on the 2nd floor of the SCC around Dec. 2003, were responsible for the electrical demolition, and they are in the process of figuring out who is responsible for the exit signs. He said the items were in a box in the upper level and Fred recalls Joe Ponturo saying we could get rid of them but Jim does not recall. Jim said his company is looking for them right now and he spoke to his foreman and the other men on the job in this effort.

Harvey asked for a list of the individuals who worked on the 2nd floor and Fred will supply same. Harvey will complete a report regarding this to the EPA tomorrow. In this report he will indicate that EJ Stewart was responsible for these items and Jim said okay. Fred did not monitor this except for that they were taken down and stored. Jim said the ballasts and lamps from the fixtures were recycled and the exit signs were put in a box and Jim said he did not know whether he was responsible or not. He was going to call and have them all removed at the same time and Joe Ponturo has the paperwork. Jim does not know if they were going to use the same company for disposal of the exit signs. Jim has never disposed of exit signs before and he said the contract says disposal of all light fixtures and ballasts. The signs are not these but they collected them and put them in a box and were trying to figure out what to do with them and then the big cardboard box disappeared. The box was stored in what is now the new Bookstore. The last time anyone can remember seeing them is approximately two months ago – maybe February. E.J. Stewart is down on the lower level now and they have been on the job every day for the last two months. Joe Ponturo says there are 10 exit signs on the lower level and Jim says they have 4 or 5 which are included in the 23.

Harvey asked Fred if they monitored these at all and Fred said they only asked for evidence of disposal via a disposal ticket which he spoke to Mike Messina of EJ Stewart about. Harvey asked Fred if there is any indication in the job records and Fred said it is in the job records, they did not have a total number and he did not know if anyone collected the serial numbers. This was a line item for the meeting agendas for a while.

Jim said EJ Stewart assumed that this was their responsibility but now that there is an issue he is looking into whether or not this should have been their responsibility.

Jim said they were directed that this was their responsibility and they proceeded accordingly. Jim asked for serial numbers and some proof that there are 23 or what the exact number is. Harvey will try to get serial numbers for the EPA report and he will indicate in the report that there appeared to be radioactive exit signs and leave it at that. Jim asked Harvey for a copy of the report which Harvey denied but said he will copy Jim that the report has gone to the state and once they get it an investigation will take place.






