Waiver_Purpose: Information is needed to complete an article in preparation about the planned irradiation facility at Honolulu International Airport.

Waiver_ExtentToExtractAnalyze: The NRC records will be used to describe the scope and specifications of the planned irradiation facility; without these records, such information will be lacking in our article.

Waiver_SpecificActivityQuals: The article that we intend to publish will inform readers about the planned irradiation facility. The qualifications I possess are: more than 30 years as a newspaper or magazine writer or editor, many awards at the state and national level for excellence in journalism. I have written articles for publication about irradiation facilities (civilian nuclear plants, DOE facilities, and sterilization facilities) for more than 20 years.

Waiver_ImpactPublicUnderstanding: At the present, there is very little information about the planned irradiation facility. Disclosures from the state and other agencies have been very limited, largely because of past outcries from the public over a proposed irradiation facility in Hawaii in the 1990s. The article we are preparing will disclose to the public, for the first time, the size and scope of this project, the people who are participating in its development, and the way in which it will require the use of state resources in its siting and construction.

Waiver_NatureOfPublic: Environment Hawaii has a readership of approximately 1,200 a month. These include most state lawmakers and cabinet-level officials, county officials, people in environmental activist organizations, planning consultants, engineers, and other members of the general public. In addition, we have a website (www.environment-hawaii.org) where most of our back issues are archived and available at no cost to interested members of the public.

Waiver_MeansOfDissemination: We will publish this information in our monthly publication.

Waiver_FreeToPublicOrFee: The material we publish is distributed to subscribers, who subscribe for a fee of \$50 a year. It is also available to the public free of charge at most public libraries in the state of Hawaii and at many state agencies, which keep the publication on file in their respective libraries.
