Purpose:

To obtain clarification to USEC's RAI responses and revised Environmental Report concerning the enrichment of uranium-235 up to 10-weight percent. During the conference call, clarification to RAI's were requested as summarized below.

RAI Discussion Summary:

- NRC requested information on "Radiological Air Quality" and "Human Health Impacts" in Sections 4.6.3.2 and 4.12.3.2 of the USEC Environmental Report. Specifically air emissions in Table 4.6.3.2-1 and Table 4.12.3.2.1-1 will need to be updated to reflect enrichment up to 10-weight percent uranium-235.
- NRC requested information on transportation of "Enriched Uranium Product" in Section 4.2.3.2.1.2 of the USEC Environmental Report. Specific information requested relative to 10-weight percent product included quantities and isotopic concentration, containers and overpacks to be used for shipping, external dose rates in the vehicle cab or outside the container, destination, and number of shipments.
- NRC requested information on "Tails to be Produced" in Section 4.13.3.4 of the USEC Environmental Report. Specifically, the mass of tails to be produced while operating at the 10-weight percent enrichment level was requested with a comparison to the mass produced at the 5-weight percent enrichment level
- USEC stated that the current Environmental Report presents the most likely impacts from operation of the ACP (i.e., enrichment to 5-weight percent). USEC indicated that while it didn't currently have any customers for uranium-235 enriched up to 10-weight percent, it did wish to maintain flexibility to meet potential future demand.
