NRC STAFF ANSWER TO MOTION TO AMEND PETITION FOR LEAVE TO INTERVENE AND REQUEST FOR HEARING FILED BY THE FRIENDS OF THE KOREAN PEOPLE

By motion docketed August 1, 1980, the Friends of the Korean People (FKP) requested that the petition for leave to intervene and for a hearing on the subject application filed by the Center for Development Policy (CDP) on June 13, 1980 be amended to allow FKP to join in the petition.

FKP, in its motion to amend the petition for leave to intervene and request for a hearing filed by CDP, has offered no reasons in addition to those set out in CDP's petition why it should be granted leave to intervene in the captioned proceeding. It may be noted that although the motion purports to be that of FKP, it was signed by CDP. There is no indication in the motion that CDP is the authorized representative of FKP.

NRC Staff's position on the matter of whether the Commission should permit intervention and hold a hearing on the subject application is set out in its answer of July 14, 1980 to CDP's petition and request. For the reasons set out in that answer, the NRC Staff recommends that the Commission deny FKP's motion to amend the CDP petition for leave to intervene and request for a hearing.
