On 12/3/93, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) received a notice of alleged hazards at your worksite at: Hwy P, Hematite, MO.

The specific nature of the alleged hazards is as follows:

Item 1. No PSM analysis at facility where more than 10,000 lbs. of ammonia is stored.

We have not determined whether the hazards exist at your workplace; and we do not intend to conduct an inspection at this time. However, since allegations of violations have been made, you are requested to investigate the alleged conditions and make any necessary corrections or modifications. Within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter, please advise me in writing of the results of your investigation. Please provide any supporting documentation of your findings, including any applicable measurements or monitoring results, and photographs which you believe would be helpful, as well as a description of any corrective action you have taken or are in the process of taking, including photographs of the corrected condition.

This letter is not a citation or a notification of proposed penalty which according to the OSH Act, may be issued only after an inspection or investigation of the workplace. If we do not receive a response from you by 1/3/94 indicating that appropriate corrective action has been taken, or that no hazard exists and why, an inspection may be conducted.

If you have any questions concerning this matter, please contact the Area Office at the address in the letterhead. Your personal support and interest in the safety and health of your employees is appreciated.
