SUBJECT: SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION, UNITS 2 AND 3 -
REGARDING CANCELLATION OF TAC NUMBERS FOR PHYSICAL
SECURITY PLAN CHANGE SUBMITTED MAY 27, 2005
(TAC NOS. MC7214 AND MC7215)

By letter dated May 27, 2005, Southern California Edison (the licensee) requested amendments to the Facility Operating Licenses NPF-10 and NPF-15 for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS), Units 2 and 3. The licensee stated that the amendments involved a change to the SONGS Physical Security Plan (PSP), for Units 2 and 3, to have a more effective use of the SONGS security force while continuing to comply with the revised Design Basis Threat, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC)-approved implementation guidance, and security plan template for PSPs. The submittal letter referenced a letter dated October 29, 2004, in which the NRC approved the SONGS PSP and amended Section 2.E of the licenses for Units 2 and 3.

The subject TAC numbers, for the NRC review of the PSP change, have incorrect planned activity (PA) and Activity codes, and are not fee billable to the licensee for the requested licensing action (i.e., the requested amendments to operating licenses). Because of this, TAC Nos. MC7214 and MC7215 are being cancelled by this memorandum, and two new TACs will be taken out, with the correct PA and Activity codes, for the licensee's proposed change to the SONGS PSP.

The time charged to the subject TACs to date has only been a few hours charged by the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation (NRR) project managers (PMs). Staff of the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident response (NSIR), which has been technically reviewing the license amendment request, has used its own TAC numbers. The few hours charged by the NRR PMs will be kept with the subject TACs.
