Dear Mr. Boyer:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 09 renewing your NRC Material License No. 13-10455-03 in accordance with your request. Your license has been renewed for a ten year term and will not expire until August 31, 2015.

Please note that changes were made to your license, including several new Conditions, which are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

- A. In order to complete your renewed license I modified/added several new Conditions, Nos. 15 and 19, to your license.

During my review of your renewal I noted that your gas chromatography/gauge authorization had not been renewed in accordance with NUREG 1556, Vol. 7, Appendix D, which would have reduced your regulatory burden and enhanced safety by providing for more comprehensive, updated safety procedures.

You are encouraged to incorporate all of the guidance contained in NUREG 1556, Vol. 7, Appendix D, at some point in the future.

Using the NUREG 1556 series documents will help ensure that your licensing correspondence is prepared more completely and in a less burdensome manner.

Generally, we advise licensees to focus on providing the information requested in the appropriate Final versions of the consolidated guidance documents in the NUREG 1556 series. For your type of program this is Volume 7, Appendix D.

In each guide, follow the "Suggested Format.." provided in the appropriate Appendix and use the suggested responses and model procedure/appendix references whenever possible, appending descriptive information as appropriate.

If you must deviate from a model procedure or suggested response, it may be possible to simply indicate what the deviation is and still use the model procedure/ suggested response as a "basic" commitment. Descriptive information may be "recycled" from

previous documents so long as it is current, complete information equivalent to the model procedure and does not contain extraneous material.

It is in your best interests to only provide those commitments, statements, representations and procedures, in a clear and explicit manner, that we require to issue your license. These documents will form the basis for the license in the last condition of the license, called the "tie-down" condition.

You will realize the benefit of a reduced regulatory burden while enhancing safety and maintaining compliance and efficiency if you establish your license in this manner. If you have further questions concerning these matters please contact me at (630) 829-9841 or (800) 522-3025.

- B. You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be available electronically in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records (PARS) component of NRC's document system (ADAMS). The NRC's document system is accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>. The enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.
