### Certification of Financial Assurance for Decommissioning – Statement of Intent

In accordance with 10 CFR 72.30(c)(4), this letter forwards an updated Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville) Statement of Intent to have adequate funds available when necessary for radiological decommissioning activities associated with the Trojan Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation (ISFSI). Bonneville's Statement of Intent, provided as an enclosure to this letter, updates a previous Statement of Intent dated March 21, 2001, to reflect termination of the Trojan Nuclear Plant License No. NPF-1 issued under 10 CFR 50.

Specifically, Bonneville's March 21, 2001, Statement of Intent applies to decommissioning costs and associated decommissioning financial assurance for both the Trojan Nuclear Plant and the Trojan ISFSI, thus satisfying the financial assurance requirements of 10 CFR 50.75(e)(1)(iv) and 10 CFR 72.30(c)(4), respectively. As of the date of this letter, Trojan Nuclear Plant radiological decommissioning is complete, and the Trojan Nuclear Plant license has been terminated.<sup>1</sup> Therefore, Bonneville has updated its Statement of Intent to eliminate references to Trojan Nuclear Plant decommissioning and the associated financial assurance requirements of 10 CFR 50.75. As such, the enclosed Statement of Intent supersedes Bonneville's March 21, 2001, Statement of Intent.

**Certification of Financial Assurance for  
Decommissioning – Statement of Intent**


In accordance with 10 CFR 72.30(c)(4), this document constitutes the Bonneville Power Administration's (Bonneville's) Statement of Intent, as a federal government agency fulfilling the decommissioning funding obligations of the Eugene Water and Electric Board (EWEB), a licensee,<sup>1</sup> to have adequate funds available when necessary for radiological decommissioning activities associated with the following facility:

Trojan Independent Spent Fuel Storage Installation (ISFSI)  
NRC Materials License No. SNM-2509  
71760 Columbia River Hwy  
Rainier, OR 97048

Such funds will be requested and obtained from the Bonneville Fund, created by the U.S. Congress as a continuing appropriation available to meet all of Bonneville cash obligations, sufficiently in advance to prevent delay of required radiological decommissioning activities.

A site-specific estimate of the costs associated with decommissioning of the Trojan ISFSI is maintained in the Trojan ISFSI Safety Analysis Report. The total decommissioning costs are estimated to be in the amount of approximately \$14,276,000 in nominal dollars, of which Bonneville is obligated to pay approximately \$4,283,000. The Bonneville obligation represented by this Statement of Intent also applies to any adjustments to the decommissioning cost estimate as incorporated into future revisions of the Trojan ISFSI Safety Analysis Report.

As Manager, Contract Generating Resources for Bonneville, I do hereby certify that I have been delegated the authority to sign this Statement of Intent. The Delegation of Authority authorizing certification of the necessary funds for decommissioning activities associated with the aforementioned license is provided as an attachment to this Statement of Intent.

<sup>1</sup> The Trojan ISFSI is jointly owned by Portland General Electric Company (PGE), 67.5 percent; the City of Eugene through the EWEB, 30 percent; and Pacific Power & Light/PacifiCorp, 2.5 percent. PGE is the majority owner and has responsibility for operating and maintaining the Trojan ISFSI. Bonneville, a federal government power marketing agency under the United States Department of Energy, is obligated through Net Billing Agreements to pay costs associated with EWEB's 30 percent share of the Trojan ISFSI, including radiological decommissioning costs.

SUBJECT: Delegation of Contracting Authority for Long-Term Generating Resource Acquisition Agreements

TO: Andrew J. Rapacz, Manager, Contract Generating Resources - PGC

Effective immediately, I hereby delegate to you, as Manager, Contract Generating Resources, contracting authority for all existing and proposed contracts and agreements related to non-federal long-term generating resources.

This delegation does not include the authority to acquire new resources. It also does not include blanket claim settlement authority, which may not be delegated below the Vice President level.

This delegation includes the authority to execute proposed contracts and agreements and to administer, amend and interpret executed contracts and agreements. This authority will be exercised with the advice of General Counsel and the Office of the Chief Risk Officer and in consultation with Environment, Fish and Wildlife and with the Office of the Chief Financial Officer. Authority to waive provisions of contracts is conditioned upon prior coordination with General Counsel and the Office of the Chief Risk Officer and, if applicable, with Office of the Chief Financial Officer.

The authorities granted in this delegation, may be further delegated; such subdelegations shall be in writing.

This delegation is a reaffirmation of John L. Hairston's delegation to you, dated February 17, 2005, subject: "Delegation of Contracting Authority for Generation Resource Acquisition, Operational Coordination of Systems, and Real-Time Power Sales."
