SUBJECT: NRC APPROVAL OF USEC INC.'S REQUEST FOR WITHHOLDING PROPRIETARY COMMERCIAL INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE FOR THE AMERICAN CENTRIFUGE PLANT (TAC NOS. L32306, L32307 and L32308)

Dear Mr. Toelle:

By letter dated July 8, 2005, containing an affidavit dated the same as the letter and executed by Steven A. Toelle, USEC Inc. (USEC) requested the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to withhold from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390, information contained in the following document:

July 8, 2005 - Sprinkler Installation for the Service Module Unloading Building

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- 1. The information sought to be withheld from public disclosure is owned and has been held in confidence by USEC.
- 2. The information is of a type customarily held in confidence by USEC and not customarily disclosed to the public.
- 3. The information is being transmitted to the NRC in confidence and, under the provisions of 10 CFR 2.390, is to be received in confidence by the NRC.
- 4. The information sought to be protected is not available in public sources or available information has not been previously employed in the same original manner or method to the best of USEC's knowledge and belief.
- 5. Public disclosure of this proprietary information is likely to cause substantial harm to the competitive position of USEC because it may enhance the ability of competitors to position and provide similar products.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of your statements, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

Therefore, the document listed above marked as proprietary, will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended. Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents.
