Dear Mr. Price:

The Superior Steel Corporation located at Carnegie. Pennsylvania, hereinafter called the applicant, hereby makes application for a Source Material License to receive, possess, use and transfer thorium.

The specific material is ingots of thorium for which the Wilcox Company has Source Material License C-3165 ense application is to cover for Ap Babcock and Wilcox Company has Source Material License C-3465. The present license application is to cover four (4) ingots. >

The work to be performed includes test runs on rolling and cutting similar to that which was done by the applicant for the Atomic Energy Commission. It is hoped that only one ingot will have to be rolled for the test. However, application is made for a license for four (4) ingots in case rolling one ingot does not yield sufficient information.

A double purpose will be served by the tests. information on rolling will be obtained. Second, it is planned to collect samples of air while tests are run under ordinary plant operating conditions. Data obtained from these samples would be required for the design and installation of ventilating, filtering and other equipment needed in the rolling of large quantities of thorium.

This method of taking air samples during test runs is a normal procedure for obtaining data for safety installations. Past practice has shown that test rollings at plants have not endangered the health and safety of plant employees and people outside the plant.

so long as exposures to radiations and air-borne materials are evaluated in terms of permissable concentrations recommended in Part 20 of the proposed AEC Standards for Protection Against Radiation.
