SHIPPER-RECEIVER DISCREPANCY OF COL-NLO #10

In answer to your request for exact information pertaining to the July 15, 1953 shipment to National Lead Company of Ohio from American Machine and Foundry (COL-NLO #10), the following report is submitted.

On May 28 and 30, 1953, two shipments of Uranium plates and scrap were received at American Machine and Foundry (SSC-COL #6; SSC-COL #8 respectively, Lot 385). The latter shipment was received in two wooden boxes per Superior Steel Company's Shipping Order No. 1739, a copy attached. Printed information on each box were as follows:

Upon opening the boxes it was noted that the contents were in various forms, Each piece of metal varied in length, thickness and shape, entwined together so that use was rejected by the receiver.

It had been contemplated that the immediate return of the shipment as scrap was the best solution, however, at the time Mr. Noto, NYO requested small samples to be salvaged for the fabrication of urgently needed specimens for Battelle Memorial Institute. As a result, 150 pounds of the material was withdrawn for this special fabrication job. Upon completion of the special fabrication job, the remaining scrap plus additional scrap from the shipment of 2204 lbs (SSC-COL #6) which pertains to this same lot, were returned to the two wooden boxes and totaled 315.5 pounds. This resulted in the net weight of 1788.5 lbs:

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The original two shipping boxes were used for trans-shipment of this scrap to NLD (COL-NLD #10). The shipment was covered by American Machine and Foundry's Shipping Order No. 47395 a copy which was submitted to your office per memorandum dated September 15, 1953.

Also attached is a complete inventory of this particular lot 385 from American Machine and Foundry which indicates an overage of 9.25 pounds. This overage was due to wet turnings which have since been shipped to MM. At the time of shipment the weight was adjusted by 6.0 pounds for a dry weight but as yet still requires a 3.25 pounds adjustment to account for the overage of 9.25. This remaining overage of 3.25 pounds was not included on the shipping form COL-MM #6 because of the inability to determine the correct dry weight.

These incidents as related and the American Machine and Foundry's inventory are in exact agreement with Station COL records. This Section is satisfied that any possibility of error has been eliminated and feel the matter has been satisfactorily explained.
