SYNOPSIS

This investigation was initiated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Office of Investigations (OI), Region II (RII), on December 22, 2004, to determine if a radiation protection technician at McGuire Nuclear Station (MNS) willfully failed to comply with health physics requirements.

Based on the evidence developed during this investigation, OI:RII did not substantiate the allegation that a MNS radiation protection technician willfully failed to comply with health physics requirements.
