SUBJECT: ALLEGATION NO. RIII-99-A-0132

This letter refers to your phone conversations with Messrs. Jay Hopkins and Monte Phillips on July 30, 1999, and August 11, 1999. During these conversations you expressed concerns related to activities at the ABB/Combustion Engineering facility in Hematite, Missouri. You stated that the licensee fired you in retaliation for complaints associated (1) with sexual harassment and (2) lack of health physics training.

On September 13, 1999, we sent you a letter informing you that the NRC needed additional information before proceeding with our inquiry of your concerns. That letter also indicated that we had left several phone messages with you requesting that you contact us to discuss your concerns. Since you have not responded to our requests for additional information, the NRC plans no further action regarding this matter and considers this issue closed.
