Dear Mr. Bailey:

The Office of State and Tribal Programs (STP) has reviewed your letter dated July 22, 2005 in response to our letter dated June 30, 2005 which transmitted our comments on California's proposed Industrial Radiography Certification regulations. These regulations correspond to 10 CFR 34. We also reviewed the additional information provided in Sections 20275, 30293 and 30253 of the Title 17 California Code of Regulations. We discussed our review of the regulations with Phillip Scott on October 11, 2005.

In response to your comments, the attached table shows three outstanding comments and one new comment that needs to be incorporated into California's proposed regulations or addressed in a legally binding requirement such as a licensing condition if the State chooses not to revise the regulations. These four remaining comments address the aspects of industrial radiography related to temporary jobsites and field stations and therefore need to be included in these requirements.

The additional information provided in your letter has enabled us to verify that your regulations meet the essential objectives of the Compatibility Category B and C designations, respectively, for comments 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, and 9.

The SRS Data Sheet summarizes our knowledge of the status of other State regulations and legal binding requirements, as indicated. Please let us know if you note any inaccuracies, or have any comments on the information contained in the SRS Data Sheet.
