Please note that Dr. Chopra is authorized for 10 CFR 35.100, 35.200 and Gd-153 for human radiography only and not 35.300 or 31.11 material as requested. This is because your NRC license does not authorize 35.300 or 31.11 and your letter dated September 15, 2005, did not request these materials. If you wish to add these materials in the future, you may request an amendment to your NRC license by addressing the appropriate sections in NUREG 1556, Vol. 9, Rev. 1 and if you are an out patient clinic only, please address how you will comply with 10 CFR 35.75.


You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
