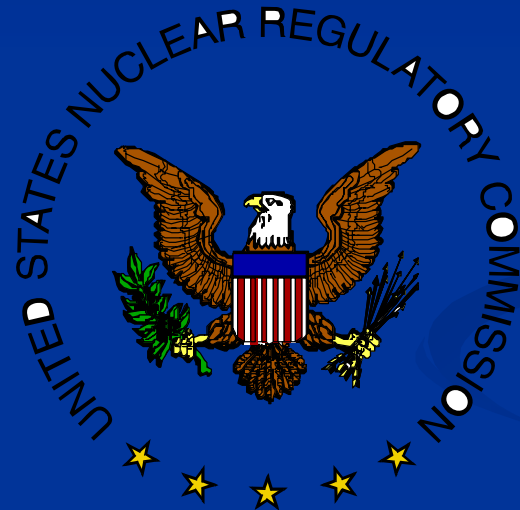

 - **Phase 3: Incorporate scenarios into six-year exercise cycle**

Lessons Learned

■ Diablo Canyon

- Coordination between licensee and ORO responders
 - Request for offsite assistance coordinated through central location
 - Diversity of communication styles, methods and standards
- Challenges with high temperature fire conditions

■ Duane Arnold

- Federal agency coordination with State and Local Organizations
 - Identification of all State and local responders to a security event
 - Federal response and demonstration with local resource capabilities
 - Impacts on State and local responders due to escalation of National Threat Level
