I am responding to your letter to Chairman Nils J. Diaz, dated November 3, 2005. You noted that you were responding to a letter from Senator Orrin Hatch, dated November 1, 2005, concerning the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) obligations under the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), related to the issuance of a license to Private Fuel Storage, LLC (PFS), for its proposed independent spent fuel storage installation. In your letter, you stated your view that the NRC has the authority to issue a license to PFS, with or without execution of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and you urged the NRC to issue a license to PFS.

As you may know, the NRC has recently determined, under the provisions of Title 36 of the <u>Code of Federal Regulations</u>, Section 800.7, to terminate the NHPA consultation process. A determination on license issuance will be made following the NRC's receipt of comments from the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP).

For your information, I have enclosed a copy of Chairman Diaz's letter to Senator Hatch, dated November 22, 2005, (Enclosure 1), and a copy of the NRC's letter to the ACHP, dated November 22, 2005 (without enclosures), terminating the NHPA consultation process (Enclosure 2).
