Dear Mr. Wolfe:

Enclosed is your NRC Material License No. 34-32570-01 in accordance with your request.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Please note that I decided not to exclude the sample written examination submitted with your application and licensing correspondence. The exam is intended to be a "living" document outlining what you will be expecting of your radiography staff when they complete your training and it is expected that you may change the exam over time without amendment to the license.

Please also note that one remaining item must be addressed to fully complete your new license. Please provide a written response to the following item within 30 days of the date of this letter, addressed to my attention, and reference it as "additional information to control number 314821." I will continue my review at that time.

In my telephone conversation records dated August 8, 2005, item 9, and November 30, 2005, item number 6, I requested your procedures for verifying and documenting the certification status of radiographers and for verifying that their certification remains valid. Your responses dated September 8, 2005, and December 5, 2005, did not address these procedures adequately.

As excerpted from NUREG 1556, Vol. 2, page 8-14 (hard copy), section 8.8, Item 8, near the end of the "Response" section:

"Submit your procedures for verifying and documenting the certification status of radiographers and for verifying that their certification remains valid. As a minimum your procedures for newly hired, previous certified individuals should require documentation of your contacting the certifying entity and confirming the certification. Your procedures should also ensure you are aware of certification expiration dates and that individuals with expired certifications do not act as radiographers."

Please be advised that your license expires at the end of the day, in the month, and year stated in the license. Unless your license has been terminated, you must conduct your program involving byproduct materials in accordance with the conditions of your NRC license, representations made in your license application, and NRC regulations.

In particular, note that you must:

1. Operate in accordance with NRC regulations 10 CFR Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers; Inspections," 10 CFR Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation," and other applicable regulations.
2. Notify NRC, in writing, within 30 days:
 - a. When the Radiation Safety Officer permanently discontinues performance of duties under the license or has a name change; or
 - b. When the mailing address listed on the license changes.
3. In accordance with 10 CFR 30.36(d) and/or license condition, notify NRC, promptly, in writing, and request termination of the license:
 - a. When you decide to terminate all activities involving materials authorized under the license; or
 - b. If you decide not to complete the facility, acquire equipment, or possess and use authorized material.
4. Request and obtain a license amendment before you:
 - a. Order byproduct material in excess of the amount, or radionuclide, or form different than authorized on the license;
 - b. Add or change the areas of use or address or addresses of use identified in the license application or on the license; or
 - c. Change ownership of your organization.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.


