Dear Mr. Chairman,

Thank you for your recent briefing on the Multinational Design Approval Program (MDAP) and its relationship to the Department of Energy's on-going Generation IV International Forum program. I am pleased that the Commission has formally approved Stage 1 of MDAP Program for implementation. I support and encourage both of these programs, and I see their integration as important to our efforts to increase energy security through the increased use of safe, secure and reliable nuclear energy.

The DOE, is in a unique position to facilitate the integration of the MDAP into GIF as a framework for more efficient and effective regulatory review and approval. GIF is a technology roadmap intended to encourage greater use of nuclear energy through international cooperation in research and development. MDAP is a natural counterpart to GIF in that MDAP, in particular the anticipated Stage 2, should facilitate a substantial degree of standardization and multinational acceptance of safety-approved designs. I have encouraged DOE's involvement and cooperation with the NRC on the MDAP effort.

Again, thank you for your briefing. The NRC has a key role to play in establishing the appropriate framework to enhance the protection of health and safety and the environment for the beneficial use of civilian nuclear energy, and I appreciate your leadership in this regard.
