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Description of the Issues (cont)

- NRC takes exception to the broad scope of material that DOE proposes to withhold
 - As stated in NRC 6/10/2005 letter:
 - Differences between DOE ISFSIs and commercial ISFSIs not articulated
 - Openness in regulatory process
 - Part 72 licensing actions
 - Freedom of Information Act Requests
 - NRC released criteria in Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 dated 12/22/2005
 - Criteria applied to other ISFSIs and resulted in more information being publicly available than DOE proposes

– DOE not the licensee for Foster Wheeler

Description of the Issues (cont)

- Some information has been released in ADAMS on these dockets
 - TMI-2 ISFSI license amendment 4 issued in June 2005
 - Incoming request, requests for additional information and staff safety evaluation report made publicly available
 - Safety evaluation report (SER) for Foster Wheeler ISFSI in response to FOIA request
 - released after DOE concurrence it did not contain sensitive information
 - SER requested by DOE to be withheld in 4/20/2005 letter
- Information has been released due to litigation associated with DOE's failure to take title to spent nuclear fuel
- Similar information already available in the licensing support network associated with Yucca Mountain

Description of the Issues (cont)

- Ownership of FOIA requests for DOE
 ISFSI information
 - DOE proposes to process some/all FOIA requests associated with ISFSIs on NRC's behalf
 - It is inappropriate for DOE to respond to these FOIA requests
- Informal agreement to consult with DOE before information is released
 - In accordance with standard FOIA procedures

RIS 2005-31 Criteria for Withholding Sensitive Information

- RIS issued on 12/22/2005
 - Some of the criteria consistent with DOE's request
 - Site specific hazards associated with nearby industrial, transportation, and military facilities
 - Some emergency planning information
 - Detailed design drawings
- DOE needs to address why:
 - RIS 2005-31 criteria is not appropriate for its ISFSI sites
 - Any special security considerations that should be taken into consideration

Withholding the Information

- Freedom of Information Act
- Licensing Actions
 - Hearing opportunities afforded in accordance with 10 CFR Part 72
- Litigation associated with DOE's failure to take title to spent nuclear fuel
- DOE's proposal that public reading rooms be established
 - Require form of identification prior to access
 - NRC issues
 - Resource and consistency issues why does this need to be done for these facilities and not nuclear power plants
 - Form of identification not required for FOIA requests
