On February 1, 2006, a conference call between U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and Louisiana Energy Services (LES) staffs was held to discuss the status of updates to revision 1 of the nuclear criticality safety (NCS) validation and verification (V&V) report related to LES' application for a uranium enrichment facility proposed to be located in Lea County, New Mexico.

Discussion:

NRC and LES staffs agreed that the V&V report would require another revision to be consistent with the information in the license application and safety evaluation report (SER). LES provided a status update with preliminary findings of attempting to resolve the issues communicated from NRC to LES during the January 27, 2006, teleconference call. LES discussed what preliminary information they found, the expected path forward, and their schedule for making changes to the V&V report.

LES staff discussed the preliminary results of using different benchmark experiments to get a normal distribution of data. LES staff had not yet made a determination exactly how the new information would be used to modify the V&V report to be consistent with the license application (i.e., re-run some calculations, use a qualitative argument).

LES staff provided a qualitative argument for the area of applicability issue with the Contingency Dump System. Based on the discussion, LES staff intends to either re-run some calculations or provide an appropriate qualitative argument for why the k_{-eff} limit equation in the license application and SER is still applicable for the facility. Otherwise, LES staff will revise the k_{-eff} limit equation in the license application. Either way, LES staff will have to revise the license application and V&V report while NRC will have to revise the SER.

LES and NRC staffs agreed to have an in-office-review in Washington, DC, during the week of February 6, 2006, for NRC to review the proposed revised information. LES staff intends to submit the revised information, following any needed changes based on the in-office-review, to NRC by February 15, 2006.
