PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT STATEMENTS

**NO INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS
(Rulemakings only)**

1. No Information Collection Requirements:

This proposed (or final) rule does not contain information collection requirements and, therefore, is not subject to the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.).

2. No Amendment to Existing Requirements:

This proposed (or final) rule does not contain a new or amended information collection requirement subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.). Existing requirements were approved by the Office of Management and Budget, approval number 3150-0044, -0017, -0020, -0011, -0021 and -0009.

INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS

3. Proposed Rulemaking and Proposed Policy Statement Containing New Information Collections:

This proposed rule (or proposed policy statement) amends information collection requirements that are subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq). This rule (or policy statement) has been submitted to the Office of Management and Budget for review and approval of the information collection requirements.

The burden to the public for this information collection is estimated to average _____ hours per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the information collection. The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission is seeking public comment on the potential impact of the information collections contained in the proposed rule (or proposed policy statement) and on the following issues:
