- ◆ MS in engineering with at least three years post-degree experience in a nuclear field.




## A message from the ANS President

## The Application

Your application for the Glenn T. Seaborg Science and Engineering Congressional Fellowship must include the following information provided in this order:

- ◆ Name
- ◆ Mailing Address
- ◆ Telephone and Fax Numbers
- ◆ Email Address
- ◆ A summary of academic and professional experience (not more than two pages)
- ◆ A brief summary of contributions to ANS National, Local, or Student meetings or governance (not more than 100 words)
- ◆ A statement of not more than two pages in length stating your reason for applying, what you hope to accomplish, and how the Fellowship will benefit you and your employer
- ◆ One letter of reference (and not more than two)

### The Process

The selection committee will evaluate all complete applications received by March 27, 2006. Finalists will be invited for interviews which will be held during the 2006 ANS Annual Meeting in June. Final selection will be based on these interviews.

## Criteria

The following factors are considered during the review of all applications:

- Extent of competence in nuclear science and technology;
- Demonstrated ability to participate in policy discussions;
- Demonstrated ability in written and oral communications; and
- Contributions to ANS.

Purposes to be fulfilled by the Fellow:

- Make expertise available to legislative and executive branch decision-makers;
- Make known the desire and ability of the ANS to contribute to national policy dialogue in the areas of competence of ANS members;
- Contribute to the career growth of the Fellow; and
- Provide visibility and benefit to ANS.

The Fellow is responsible for his or her living expenses in the DC area and is expected to attend a two-week orientation in September 2006. The Fellowship term is one calendar year, beginning in January 2007.

The Fellow will receive a stipend of \$45,000, plus a small travel allowance to attend ANS national meetings.


# The Fellowship

The ANS Glenn T. Seaborg Science and Engineering Congressional Fellowship provides a stipend for the successful candidate to work in a Congressional office (either House or Senate) for a year, providing advice on science and engineering matters to a member of Congress and his or her staff. The purpose of the Fellowship is to bring a reasoned and knowledgeable view of nuclear matters to Congress and to act as a science and engineering resource for Congress.

The Fellowship is planned as part of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) Congressional Science and Engineering Fellowship Program.

ANS will provide assistance with placement of the Fellow in a Congressional office.
