Hello Randy:

Just following up on our telephone call from last Wednesday. There are approximately five workers, plus or minus a couple, at Salem and Hope Creek that would like to sit down with you as soon as your schedule permits it (i.e., your next trip to the area) to discuss their safety concerns. These workers are a combination of management and union. To protect their identities, they are proposing to meet at a Friends Meeting Place in Woodstown, NJ, north of the site.

I briefly sketched out the value of such a meeting in our call last week. These workers have lost faith in the company's promises to reform. Their lack of patience has them ready and willing to go to the media. Their meeting with you would not replace existing NRC processes for handling/evaluating safety concerns (i.e., the allegation and OI processes). Instead, it would supplement those processes. My expectation for the meeting would be that the workers would leave with the belief, as I believe, that the NRC is taking the problems very seriously and will get them fixed in time and that you would leave with a more complete understanding of the situation at the site.

I realize such a meeting is not business as usual for the NRC. I would neither advocate it nor seek it unless I felt it stood a very good chance of benefitting all participants.
