Dear Mr. Virgilio:

This is in response to your December 27, 2005 letter concerning New York State Agreement Program heightened oversight due to the overdue adoption of Nuclear Regulatory Commissioner (NRC) regulations. We have reviewed the list of overdue regulations transmitted with your letter and have attached the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's (DOHMH) plan to address these regulations as requested.

We anticipate the full adoption of both RATS ID # 1995-2 (Frequency of Medical Examinations for Use of Respiratory Protection Equipment) and RATS ID # 2002-1 (Revision of Skin Dose Limit) by the fall of 2006. The adoption of RATS ID # 1999-3 (Respiratory Protection and Controls to Restrict Internal Exposure) is expected to be completed by April 2007. We would like to note that at this time the DOHMH is not aware of any current licensees that have or require a respiratory protection program.

One section of RATS ID # 2002-2 (Medical Use of Byproduct Material) has been adopted, other sections are not applicable to our program, and the adoption of the remaining and applicable sections in 10 CFR 35 will be addressed jointly with the New York State Health Department in order to avoid having proposed amendments to our Health Code be construed as less restrictive than the State's Part 16 regulations dealing with medical use. Please note that RATS ID #2005-1 (Security Requirements for Portable Gauges Containing Byproduct Material) is not under the purview of the DOHMH, but falls under the New York State Department of Labor.

We will incorporate into our plan for adoption RATS ID #2003-1, RATS ID #2004-1 and RATS ID #2005-2 in time frames that that will allow for the drafting, General Counsel review, State program review, STP review and Board of Health approvals in order to comply with the required NRC timelines.

We plan on sending, under separate cover, the regulatory changes that were adopted during the March 2005 Board of Health meeting for final review and comment by NRC. We shall use the SA-201 format for this submittal and will have it to NRC for review by April 28, 2006.
