

Fitness-for-Duty Program Six Month Performance Report July – December 2005

PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The Arkansas Nuclear One annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this six month reporting period, approximately 26.7 percent of the population was randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing for this period was 0.64 percent. The total random percentage for the year was 53.0.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

During this six month reporting period, 2257 samples were collected and tested. Twenty samples were confirmed positive for alcohol or illegal drugs. Two contractors refused to test.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

Nine contractors submitted pre-access samples that tested positive for THC, two at the Entergy cut-off level and seven at the NRC cut-off level. All nine contractors were denied access.

Five additional contractors submitted pre-access samples that tested positive for illegal drugs. Two tested positive for amphetamines and three tested positive for cocaine. These contractors were also denied access.

One contractor refused the urine portion of his pre-access test and was denied access.

Three contractors submitted random breathalyzer samples that tested positive for alcohol and another submitted a sample that tested positive for THC at the Entergy cut-off level. One contractor submitted a behavioral for-cause sample that tested positive for alcohol. All five contractors had their unescorted access revoked.

Two pre-access contractors that required direct observation samples were denied access. One tested positive for THC at the NRC cut-off level and the other refused direct observation testing.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC:

Two blind QA samples sent in the same batch to the HHS laboratory were reported as negative. This issue was resolved through Entergy's Corrective Action Program.

A contract supervisor tested positive for alcohol and was reported to the NRC. A second contract supervisor did not report to FFD after initiation of for-cause testing and was reported as a refusal to test. Subsequently, this determination was overturned by appeal.

PROGRAM EVALUATION:

No programmatic problems were identified during this reporting period.
