Situation Descriptions, Management Actions, and NRC Reportable Events

A. <u>Situation Descriptions</u>

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- 1. One (1) Employee was confirmed positive for Marijuana as a result of Random drug and alcohol test.
- 2. One (1) Contractor was confirmed positive for Alcohol as a result of Preaccess drug and alcohol test.
- 3. One (1) Contractor was confirmed positive for Opiates as a result of a Random drug and alcohol test.
- 4. One (1) Contractor was confirmed positive for Marijuana as a result of a Pre-access drug and alcohol test.
- 5. One (1) Contractor refused to test after being notified to report for a Random drug and alcohol test.

B. <u>Management Actions (in Response to Situation Descriptions)</u>

The following actions were taken by management as a result of the above situation descriptions:

- 1. Unescorted access was removed.
- 2. Review of safety-related work was performed, where applicable. No remedial actions were required.

C. NRC Reportable Events (Per 10CFR Part 26.73)

There was one Reportable Event during this performance data period. The individual from Situation Description #1 was a Licensed Operator. The NRC was notified within 24 hours of this event per 10 CFR 26.73. In a letter, dated October 25, 2005, "Response to NRC Request for Information Regarding a Licensed Operator Positive Fitness-For-Duty Test," Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station (NMPNS) stated that the individual was no longer an employee of Constellation Energy as of September 27, 2005. At the time of the submittal there were no plans for follow-up testing or rehire of this individual. Subsequently, NMPNS rehired this individual in January 2006 to perform non-licensed operator activities. The individual is subject to Fitness for Duty follow-up testing as part of a prescribed treatment plan per the Employee Assistance Program.
