SUBJECT: PROPOSED AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF MINNESOTA

By letter dated January 18, 2006, we informed you of the impending Agreement between the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and the State of Minnesota, whereby, the NRC will relinquish regulatory authority for certain licenses of byproduct, source, and special nuclear material. We also explained that your NRC license, which authorized licensed activities to be performed in Minnesota and at temporary job sites anywhere in the United States where NRC maintains jurisdiction, required an amendment prior to the transfer. This action is necessary since authorization to conduct licensed activities at temporary job sites in NRC-regulated states will no longer be valid once the Agreement is signed and Minnesota assumes regulatory authority.

In our letter, we asked that you review your current program and decide if you wish to continue unlimited licensed activities in states that are under NRC jurisdiction. In your response, you indicated that you wish to amend your NRC license to delete authorization for temporary job sites in NRC-regulated states, but keep temporary job site authorization for Minnesota only.

We have amended your license (enclosed) according to your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font. We will transfer your current license to the State of Minnesota on the effective date of the Agreement, which is March 31, 2006.
