





170 and 171 - REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPANDED DEFINITION OF  
BYPRODUCT MATERIAL

The Office of Information Services has reviewed the subject proposed rule for information management and information technology implications and concurs in it provided that the Paperwork Reduction Act Statement (PRAS) is changed to Enclosure 1, including the response to the 8 captions contained in the PRAS, and the Statement of Consideration (SOC), "dates" and "addresses," is changed to Enclosure 2. The changes to the SOC are provided to distinguish the differences between the comment period for the rule and the OMB clearance package, and the differences in the contacts and the method for submitting comments for the rule and the OMB clearance package.

The rule has been placed on hold with the Office of Administration pending the incorporation of the identified changes into the rule and receipt and approval of the OMB clearance package in sufficient time for it to be received by OMB no later than the date the rule is scheduled for publication in the Federal Register.
