Dear Mr. Garcia,

This is to document my understanding resulting from our telephone conversation of July 28, 1986 regarding the proposed United Nuclear Corporation (UNC) evaporation ponds permitted by the State of New Mexico permit DP-146. Your points, as I understood them, were as follows:

- 1. Certain jurisdictional issues relating to NRC enforcement of EPA Standards remain subject to negotiation between NRC and EPA.
- 2. Pending final resolution of these issues, your office is assuming that applicable EPA Standards will be enforced by NRC. In UNC's case, this means that NRC will not approve the construction of their proposed ponds unless they comply with EPA's Standards.
- 3. UNC must apply for Source Material License amendment which NRC must then approve subject to (2) above, before construction of these ponds can begin. UNC has not yet filed an amendment application for these ponds.
