FirstEnergy to pay \$28 million fine

FirstEnergy Corp. dodged federal prosecution Friday by paying a \$28 million fine, agreeing its employees lied about the Bessemer nuclear power plant years ago and committing to cooperation with ongoing investigations.

Attorney Greg White recip-

rocated by acknowledging that FirstEnergy's nuclear division has changed its corporate culture and made extensive repairs to the Toledo-area plant.

White and a team of prosecutors announced the plea deal just a day after releasing a five-count indictment of two former FirstEnergy engineers and a consultant, accusing them of creating false documents and lying to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in the fall

of 2001. That's when the company was fighting to delay a shutdown for an emergency reactor lid inspection. If convicted, the three face up to five years in jail and fines of up to \$250,000.

White on Friday also released a plea agreement his office negotiated with a fourth former Davis-Besse worker, engineer Prasoon Goyal, who now resides in California.

■ Ottawa County Emergency Management Association: \$500,000

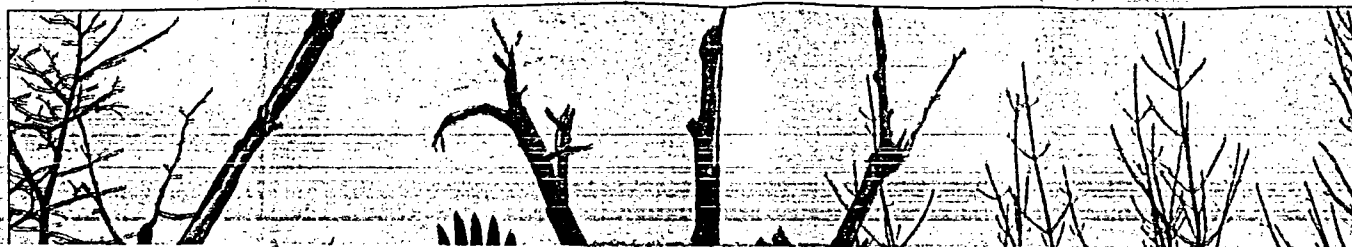
■ University of Toledo Foundation: \$500,000.
