

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS," PROPOSED RULE

We have reviewed the subject proposed rule for compliance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.) The rule meets our criteria for an insignificant burden collection and does not require Office of Management and Budget (OMB) review. However, please replace the Paperwork Reduction Act Statement with the attached. We concur in the rulemaking. However, the rule will remain on hold with the Office of Administration pending incorporation of the attached Paperwork Reduction Act Statement into the rule.

We are modifying the NRC Form 670, "Information Required for Making an Insignificant Burden Determination to Support a Decision that OMB Clearance is Not Required," to clarify the description of changes to information collections. We will coordinate the changes with you before sending the form to OMB. This will not impact the movement of the rule through NRC concurrence.

IX. Paperwork Reduction Act Statement

This proposed rule increases the burden on licensees to report and maintain records under 10 CFR Parts 20, 30, 31, 32, and 150. The public burden increase for this information collection is estimated to average 1 hour per request. Because the burden for this information collection is insignificant, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) clearance is not required. Existing requirements were approved by the Office of Management and Budget, approval number 3150-0014, 3150-0016, 3150-0120, and 3150-0001.
